**Mr I M Groenewald (FF Plus) to ask the Minister of Forestry, Fisheries and the Environment:**

- (1) What total number of municipalities in each province have applied for and received waste licences for hazardous waste activities in terms of section 45 of the National Environmental Management: Waste Act, Act 59 of 2008, from her department;
- (2) whether she will make a statement on the matter?

### **1964. THE MINISTER OF FORESTRY, FISHERIES AND THE ENVIRONMENT REPLIES:**

- (1) There are only two municipalities in South Africa that applied in terms of section 45 of the National Environment Management: Waste Act, 2008 (Act No. 59 of 2008), namely:
  - Cape Town Metropolitan Municipality applied for and received a Waste Management Licence for the disposal of both General and Hazardous Waste.
  - Eden District Municipality applied for and received a waste management licence for the Disposal of both General and Hazardous Waste.
